NOTICE REGARDING DEFENDANT'S ACCESS TO

COMES NOW the State of Arizona, by and through the Pima County Attorney, LAURA CONOVER, and her Deputy, RACHEL STILES, and hereby files its notice regarding the Defendant's access to legal resources.

The Defendant's Motion to Represent Self was granted on March 20, 2025, in this cause number. William Parven, Esq. was appointed as the Defendant's Advisory Counsel on the same date.

On March 28, 2025, the Court ordered that the Defendant be permitted access to the Law Library at the Pima County Jail as to this cause number. On April 1, 2025, the Defendant informed the Court and Counsel that the jail does not have a Law Library anymore and that he had not been able to access legal resources to be able to represent himself.<sup>1</sup> The Defendant further stated that there was one tablet per twenty-five inmates.

The State contacted the Pima County Jail regarding the Defendant being able to access legal materials. On April 2, 2025, the State learned that each tablet is stocked with legal research resources via LexisNexis. The jail has a contract with LexisNexis, and it is free for the inmates to access. The State also learned that there is one tablet issued for every two-person cell. The jail confirmed that the law library is available to every inmate now electronically through the tablet.

On April 10, 2025, a captain at the jail confirmed that the Defendant has been consistently accessing the law library via LexisNexis on his tablet since March 21, 2025. The Defendant is able to have the material he needs printed by putting in a request with the law librarian. He is able to access writing materials by purchasing them through the commissary, or if he is indigent, by putting in a request form and they will be provided.

Furthermore, the State reached out to the Office of Court Appointed Counsel (OCAC). Counsel was informed that Mr. Parven, as the Defendant's Advisory Attorney, can request writing materials if his client is indigent and those can be provided.

Additionally, Mr. Parven can be provided with a laptop with the applications necessary to

review the electronic disclosure with the Defendant.

In State v. Henry, 176 Ariz. 569 (1993), the Arizona Supreme Court noted that a

criminal defendant has a constitutional right to represent himself. Id. at 584. The Court

found that when "a defendant in custody exercises that right, the Fifth Amendment

guarantee of access to the courts requires that he or she be provided an adequate law library

or assistance from someone trained in the law." Id. The Court also noted that "Library

access is only one permissible means of affording the right of meaningful self-

representation. Legal help is another." *Id.* Furthermore, the Court held that "[a]n inmate

does not have the right to select his or her preferred means of access." Id. "Due process

rights are violated only when a defendant is denied all meaningful access to prepare a

defense." Id.

In this case, the Defendant has access to an electronic law library to do legal research

in this case. He also has an advisory attorney who is able to assist him in his defense and

is able to provide him access to be able to review all of the discovery in this case.
