This is probably my 15th letter to you. Forgive me for not going to college where I may have learned to politely redress my grievances with my government.

You and I have lived completely opposite lives. As a female General Contractor and owner of a construction business who has also worked many years in the logging industry, running chain saws and working alongside, or managing crews of strong, brave, intelligent men like Lane Myers, I find him easy to relate to! I'm old enough to be his mother, and I love him like a son! Polite people don't survive in the woods. "Excuse me, excuse me, sir, there is a tree falling and it is going to hit you if you don't move." "My bad, he's dead." Or should I speak more directly ...like get the fuck out ...get out...get out!!! Yes. That saves lives.

Lane has also worked in the timber industry, from what I gather. He also grew up in a house with swat raids happening on his 5th birthday. Because I've listened to hundreds of hours of his story telling, I feel like I can relate to him in some ways, but not all. How we grow up is not our choice but it does develop our personality for the rest of our lives.

These letters are just little old me trying to tell you to not be so offended when he's talking. He's not violent. It's just how some people communicate. I respect Lane so much because he tells the truth and he sticks up for what is right and fair.

I've nearly lost my life several times on the job so even at my age, I speak in a very direct manner like my life depends on it. The word "fuck" is one of my main emphasis words. I use it when I burn the eggs, or when I throw the track off my excavator. I use it when I smash my finger with a hammer or when I'm telling a hilarious joke! I use it when I'm fucking sad, and when I'm fucking mad. I mean no harm by it. It's just how I've had to be to blend in with my crews, log truck drivers, etc. I stay away from people who are so fragile that they can't look past the F word.

Again, I can't relate to people like you who seem weak. I would not pick you for my survival team, I would not call you for help, ever. Your brain was trained to operate like a book. That will not get you far in the woods, I'll tell you that for sure. But we CAN co-exist if I stay away from your type. I only wish you could be less hateful

toward people like me and Lane.

In regards to Lane Myers and the case brought by Arizona regarding Myers' conduct related to Shannon Walker.

My Name is Derek Kirk and I'm a native of Reno, NV. As far back as I can remember I've been fascinated with History, Social Sciences and Government. I tune into educational, historical and current social issues in my spare time and whenever able to use headphones while at work. In my fleeting spare time I love to travel to historical sites and see the land for myself that conflicts took place. I try to understand the social issues that caused the conflict to begin with. I also do public service through my activism platform BlueLineTransparency.

I obtained a Paralegal Degree in my spare time with emphasis on Constitutional issues. And I've successfully utilized that knowledge in Pro SE litigation against government with teams of lawyers that had more motion practice know-how but less wisdom than myself.

Lawsuits are time consuming, costly and ineffective towards the ultimate goal which goes beyond making the injured party whole, but rather changing the mindset of the people causing the injury. Public exposure and shame has been used far more effectively for as far back as records go. A fine isn't very convincing to the shoplifter but the community being aware of this behavior more often IS convincing.

In modern times no different than in ancient times there are people in government roles that do things they shouldn't be doing and it's always been dangerous and tricky to confront these bad actors in a way that doesn't exist with ordinary citizens. With lawsuits being ineffective, the next best medicine is public scrutiny and that's where our modern day print press, the internet, shines!

Throughout history the most violent conflicts have occurred proceeding communications ceasing. That's the wisdom of Freedom of Speech! That does and should come with the caveat that we can't use words with the intention of scaring one another.

As an opinionated American who believes non violence is paramount, I would not support Mr. Myers if I had knowledge of him threatening harm to Ms. Walker or her family. I've closely followed this case from its onset and done my own digging and I've seen zero evidence, nor heard any allegations that Mr. Myers made any threats. Rather I've seen him subjectively annoy Ms. Walker. From my perspective the States actions here are the ONLY reason hundreds of thousands of people around the country, including myself are even hearing Shannon Walkers name. Therefore the burden of any distress this has caused Ms. Walker lies with the prosecutor.

Whether the person subject to public scrutiny is actually guilty of alleged conduct, or whether the alleged conduct is sufficiently serious, I think should, and rightfully is, irrelevant to whether a person can publish that opinion without restraint absent threats of violence. What if Mr. Myers was publishing his opinions about a convicted child predator, would that change things here? If the answer to that is yes, I think we have Viewpoint Discrimination and that just cannot stand in a civilized society!

I would be appalled if Mr. Myers was charged with a petty misdemeanor for speaking words alone, and would be far more interested in a prosecutor now convincing me what line was crossed, that I apparently wasn't aware of, that

justifies criminal prosecution. However the level of terror that's been inflicted upon Mr. Myers and his family would seem due a violent criminal, not to a person who talked about a person whom is easily offended.

I've only been to Arizona one time to visit the Grand Canyon one weekend a couple years ago and I have a speeding ticket to prove it! However I'm now afraid for my own safety because of the mess Pima County has made here. If I peacefully speak my mind about this case and the parties involved I could well be indicted, kidnapped by law enforcement and drug to a county I've never even been to. And the only thing the prosecutor here has shown me is that a man was very annoying to somebody who's well connected which itself is eyebrow raising.

I'm nervous to even write this letter to the court because if I'm too harsh with my words about the prosecutor my life and that of my family could change significantly out of what I see as retaliatory. I'm a peaceful and law abiding citizen, however I'm left taking guesses at what words could be criminal in Arizona. And before the prosecutor can answer "it's actions not words", that's hogwash, of course it's about the words! If Mr. Myers had nothing but pleasant things to say about Ms. Walker he wouldn't be charged with a crime!

If this court intends on maintaining any level of respect and dignity from a Nation that's watching over this case, it will tread lightly. The appropriate action from this point is to release Mr. Myers and delay sentencing until the appeals courts can have a thorough look.

I don't see any probability this case is over rather a plea was taken to facilitate either release or access to appropriate law library to facilitate a meaningful appeal on Constitutional grounds that aren't waived even through a plea. Any future prior restraint orders similarly do not lose appealability.

Clarence Brandenburg was a punk. However Ohio succeeded at convincing everyone they had clowns running the show. Don't bring shame to Arizona the way Ohio did.

I write to request that this Court sentence Lane Jeffery Myers to community supervision, with reasonable conditions, following his guilty plea to two felony charges. Community supervision, with conditions sufficient to protect the rights of all involved parties, will ensure the safety of the community while causing the least amount of harm possible.

I have known Lane Myers for 3.5 years. During that time, Lane has helped me in more ways than I can list. With his support, I was able to recover from a serious injury and illness I experienced in 2020-21. Lane helped me recover and rebuild my health in a way that I don't think anyone else could have. Lane was there for me during the terminal illness and death of my father in 2022, when I traveled to Michigan multiple times to assist my parents. He also supported me during a time in my career when I was working/commuting for up to 12 hours per day. During that time, he cared for my dog, maintained my bike, and took care of other obligations so that I was able to serve my community as a federal law clerk. He supported me in becoming a homeowner. He also helped me fulfill a lifelong dream of a month-long road trip across the western United States.

Lane has not only been instrumental in helping me improve my life but has played that role for many people in various ways. Lane is an indispensable source of emotional and psychological support and encouragement, for me and for others. Lane has had many long-term friendships and relationships throughout his life and remains in contact with many of those people. He is a caring and attentive owner of his dog, Tilly, who he rescued ten years ago. From approximately 2015 to 2023, Lane was immersed in the mountain biking community and spent significant time coaching mountain biking and participating in racing events. He is a pro-social, empathetic,

and outspoken person whose expressive communication is not always consistent with his intentions.

I am aware that Lane can be difficult to communicate with at times, and that his communication style differs from norms that many people expect. In some ways, social media exacerbates this disconnect. While I personally do not condone Lane's communication style in professional and legal settings, many people have no issue with it. A community should tolerate diversity and freedom of expression and viewpoint as long as it does not harm others. There are no allegations in this case of Lane threatening the safety of Ms. Walker or anyone else. Conditions restricting Lane's ability to post regarding Ms. Walker on social media are sufficient to stop the conduct complained of in this case.

Prison is also not warranted here because during the events giving rise to this case, Lane held a good faith belief that he was acting within the confines of the law. As the Court may be aware, Lane has a pro se Westlaw account and has spent significant time researching First Amendment and other federal case law. The conflict in this case arises at least partly out of differing, good faith interpretations of the law. Conflicts between criminal law and First Amendment rights have existed in ever-changing contexts throughout this nation's history.

I understand that Ms. Walker has been negatively impacted by Lane's social media posts. I do not believe that Lane intended to cause harm or violate the law by posting on social media. At the time of sentencing, Lane will have already been incarcerated in Pima County Jail for over three months. The term of incarceration already served is sufficient to deter future similar conduct by Mr. Myers. There is no rational reason to expend further public resources to incarcerate an individual who does not pose a safety risk to himself or others. Lane has a safe and stable place to reside, and family and community support to abide by conditions of release. He should be given an opportunity to continue contributing to his household, family, and community. I believe he will use such an opportunity to improve himself and recommit to the things in life that truly matter to him. I therefore respectfully request that this Court sentence Lane Myers to a term of community supervision with conditions that balance and protect the rights of all involved parties.





16 Salutations Judge Metcalf,

17 My name is Kenny Lemens; a Catholic, American citizen in service to my
18 vocation of marriage by being a loyal husband & a loving father, supported
19 through a career of Civil Engineering and Computer Programing. This letter
20 is written within the capacity of a concerned, American Citizen; of which it is
21 my obligation (and privilege) to be an advocate to Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant).
22 I am not a relative, nor am I a close acquaintance of Mr. Lane Myers

1 (Defendant); Rather, I have been consuming his published works periodically
2 for the past (6) months.

3 Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) has an interesting personality, of which if I
4 were attempting to write a 「Personality Letter」, my struggle for the proper
5 words could rival a saga like the ILLIAD. His choice of profanity, the tone of his
6 voice, and his choice of attire may merit some concern to us. However, we
7 find ourselves fortunate that we merely need to provide you with some insight
8 into the character of Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant).

9 With regards to duties, morals and ethics: I hold Mr. Lane Myers

13 William J. Paven, Esq. was serving as Counsel for Mr. Lane Myers
14 (Defendant): Even though he was at odds with his counsel, he did not
15 "Sovereign Citizen" himself in those hearings, you never had to consider
16 placing him on notice for behavior issues. This is why allowing
17 livestreaming/broadcasting the court procedures is paramount: I am
18 diligently looking to see if Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) is a creditable person,

1 if he is a person to defend or associate with, if he is a liar, if he is a fraud, if he
2 is violent, if he is just hooligan performing Tomfoolery and Shenanigans; of
3 which all of these: **none could I find.** I see Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) as
4 sincere: he isn't masquerading to get "Clicks 'n Views" on YouTube, but rather
5 he truly is on a pursuit to Justice, that true Justice is a worthwhile cause, even

8 accepted with grace.).

9 As citizens, we have a duty to participate in our government; we negate
10 this at great peril. For this, I don't just hold Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) in
11 high regard, I applaud his dedication to pursue Nonviolent Social Change. He
12 achieves this by reading case law, by reading and understanding the Justice
13 Court Rules of Civil Procedure, by exercising and invoking his rights when
14 required, by representing himself Pro-se. I can say without reservation that
15 Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) has given me the resources and knowledge of
16 understanding the nuances and pitfalls of the legal system, from laws to rules,
17 from motions to objections, from dispositions to discovery; He has fulfilled
18 this duty of being a well-informed and active citizen, even to the point that
19 Michael Ehline, Esq. is willing to take Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) under his

1 wing to be his protégé, that addressing some of his personality issues and
2 some more legal knowledge: Mr. Myers is fully capable of becoming an
3 defense attorney to hold in high regard.

4 As I approach the conclusion of this letter, I remind you that you are of
5 the Judicial branch, and the Prosecutor is of the Executive Branch: that you
6 have a higher obligation to the defendant, who is innocent until they can be
7 proven guilty, than to assume the prosecution “knows what is best.” We
8 should be very wary of the prosecution who claims to have a strong case, but
9 allows a plea-deal for only (2) charges; they might be more interested in
10 ‘winning’ this case than to pursue justice at its own cost which would make a
11 mockery of you, of the defense, and of the alleged victim. While I have no
12 claim to his innocent (especially *after* he accepted a plea deal), I will urge you
13 to place yourself in the shoes of a pro-se litigant, locked in jail for 80+ days
14 with limited means/methods to file motions and prepare his case: only a very
15 few of us can perform under those situations; Mr. Lane Myers (Defendant) at
16 least desires our respect to this effect, that he remains unchanged and firm.


17 As a Catholic and a professional engineer, I hold morals and ethics to a
